

The November 19th meeting of the Lima Historical Society features a slide-illustrated program by Dr. Preston Pierce on the Underground Railroad in the Genesee—Finger Lakes Region. "Don't Ask; Don't Tell" explains the wide-spread movement to help freedom seekers (escaped slaves) move through upstate New York to freedom in Canada.

It examines the political and social impact of slavery, the fugitive slave laws, and the abolition movement on the residents of our area. The story is told through documents and images as well as the life stories of some of the people involved—the famous and those not-so-well-known. A few of the many "station stops" and safe houses used by those involved will be shown.

Dr. Pierce is Ontario County Historian and Regional Archivist, for the Documentary Heritage Program at the Rochester Regional Library Council which serves libraries, archives, historical societies, and educational institutions in Monroe, Livingston, Ontario, Wayne and Wyoming Counties. Before Facebook: Carte de Visite Recalls A Young Lima Woman





Carte de Visite photographs, or calling cards (2 ½" by 4"), eagerly exchanged among friends and family during the late 19th century, were the popular social media of the day. This photo, taken by Miller and Upton, Photographers, of Lima, can be identified as that of 19 or 20-year old Flora Ellis dated by the 2-cent tax revenue stamp on the reverse side. The tax was levied by the government on photographs and other media to help finance the Civil War between 1864 and 1866.

Flora Amelia Ellis (born in 1845) resided in the Rochester St. home that now serves as the Tennie Burton Museum. She came to Lima in 1856 with her family who were seeking quality educational opportunities for their children. She was the daughter of physician, Dr. Samuel Ellis, who practiced medicine in Lima, and his wife Natalia. According to the 1870 census, the Ellis household included Flora (25) by then a music teacher, Samuel (23), a young doctor, Isabel (22), and PollyWaterman (75), probably Natalia's mother.

Flora graduated from Genesee Wesleyan Seminary and Genesee College here Lima, and went on to receive a Ph.D. in music from Syracuse University. Renowned as an organist and teacher, herself, she married the famous artist/muralist and Professor of Art, Newton Alonzo Wells in 1878, and eventually moved to Illinois. They had one son, Reginald Ellis Wells, born in 1881.
