The Genesee Valley Canal 1840-1878

Our Annual Dinner Meeting will be held on Sunday afternoon, May 18th, at the historic Avon Inn. We are looking forward to a very interesting program on *The Genesee Valley Canal 1840-1878* to be presented by Julie B. Hewitt, a Jamestown, New York attorney with a lifelong passion for local history.

The Genesee Valley was one of seven lateral canals built in New York State to connect towns in Livingston County and further south with the Erie Canal. Completed as far as Mount Morris in 1840, it allowed relatively "fast transit" of grains, lumber, goods and passengers from all over our county to and from the city of Rochester and destinations east and west. It provided a huge economic stimulus to farmers and residents from across the county, but turned out to be a short-lived boost for unanticipated reasons.

Please join us on May 18th at 1:30 for Sunday dinner at the Avon Inn followed by this intriguing program about a colorful period in the history of our region. Hear some of the hidden stories behind the canal and its construction.


NEW EXHIBIT

A Shadow Over the Earth: Lessons from the Extinction of the Passenger Pigeon

2014 marks the 100th anniversary of the extinction of the passenger pigeon– once the most abundant bird species in North America. The story holds lessons for us regarding modern-day species and habitat decline, and the risks of future mass extinctions.

The Tennie Burton Museum will be displaying exhibit materials provided by The University of Michigan Museum of Natural History to tell this story of very rapid extinction 100 years ago. We will also be displaying Lima's own 19th century "pigeon net"--one of the earliest items in our collections, donated by the DAR.
