The History of the Civilian Conservation Corps in Letchworth Park



Between 1933 and 1941, over 3000 young men served in the four CCC camps located in Letchworth State Park. Come and learn about this program and its legacy in our region. The program explores life in the CCC camps, the work projects, and the interaction between the camps and surrounding communities through photographs, documents and stories collected from the Park archives and from CCC veterans.

CCC enrollees work to plant evergreens near the gate of Camp 49 at the Lower Falls in 1936. They and other young men would plant thousands of trees and build miles of roadways, cabin areas, shelters, walls and more over the eight years the four CCC camps operated in the Park.

Lima Historical Society was founded to collect and preserve Lima's history, its architectural structures, and its culture to educate and inspire people today and tomorrow.

#### The History of Telephones in Lima

Excerpted from "Lima, The Crossroads of Western New York" by Mabel Furner Jenks, 1964, p. 46

"Telephone service began in Lima in a very small way some time after 1890 when a single telephone instrument of the Bell Telephone Company, connected with Honeoye Falls, was installed in the back room of the drugstore owned by Edward Salmon or Dr. Salmon, as he was known locally...

About 1900, due to an increased demand for telephones, a small switchboard, accommodating about twenty-five subscribers, was installed in the Salmon store, then operated by George T. Salmon, who succeeded his father in the drug business. This switchboard was open certain hours of the day under the supervision of Mr. Salmon and his son, Harold, who was the first telephone operator in Lima. A few years later this small switchboard was replaced by a larger one and operated around the clock.

About 1910, the Federal or Home Telephone Company placed a switchboard in the Allen Block on Rochester Street...and both systems were in operation until 1918 when a consolidation of the two systems into the Rochester Telephone Corporation took place, and all telephone service was centralized in the Main Street location. Also about 1910, the equipment was taken from the store and placed in a room directly over it on the second floor, where it remained with two other switchboards installed later, to serve a greatly increased list of subscribers.



Old switchboard is now at the Tennie Burton Museum. Come, see it for yourself, and maybe even take a selfie.

These three switchboards, of the old-style magneto type, manually operated, were in use, manned by eight regular and relief operators for over 50 years until in 1957, when the new dial system, installed in a new building purchased erected...on а site on Rochester Street...where the old Town Hall once stood. The modern dial system has a capacity of about 700 stations, or telephones, with room for expansion to double that number, and gives Lima the latest electronic, dial switching service now in widespread use nearly everywhere. Probably in another fifty years that will be superseded by equipment as radically different as these two types are now." IF SHE ONLY KNEW!!!
