# The History of Mendon Ponds Park By William Lane

#### **Lima Town Hall**



On Saturday afternoon, March 21<sup>st</sup> at 1 PM at the Lima Town Hall, William Lane, Curator of the Honeoye Falls/Mendon Museum will present an interesting talk on the history of the Mendon



Ponds Park. When, how and why was our favorite "local" park created? What was there before the land became a park?

Herman L. Fairchild, a Geology professor at the University of Rochester started the ball rolling in 1926 when he pointed out and highlighted the value and uniqueness of the glacial topography, the ponds, the botanical variety, and historical interest of land in the towns of Mendon and Pittsford. Two years later in 1928 the Monroe County Board of Supervisors voted to acquire 1400 acres of land for preservation as a park—Monroe County's third park. Several subsequent purchases expanded the park to its present 2500 acres.

Come and hear the ins and outs, as well as the politics, of making Mendon Ponds Park the place that we all enjoy so much today. Free and open to the public. Handicap accessible.

### **Putting a Human Face on Our Historic Collections**

Who says history is dry? Photographs make artifacts and buildings come alive, and none makes the point more vividly than this photo on the left of two young girls—May and Belle Chapin—probably taken ca.1880/82 in matching plaid dresses included in our 19<sup>th</sup> century clothing collections. Even better, the younger of the two girls, Belle Chapin Tenny, owned and lived in the home that now serves as our museum. She generously donated it to the Lima Historical Society for that sole purpose in 1972. An 1897 photo of Belle on the right shows her graduation photo from Genesee Wesleyan Seminary.

#### The Evolution of the Lima Crossroads

A number of buildings have disappeared over the years in downtown Lima, perhaps none more significant than the one that stood at the Four Corners—in the southwest quadrant (fronting on both West Main Street and Lake Avenue) in what was known as the Gordon block. The building was built sometime in the mid 1800's and was torn down in 1936. For sixty years before that, however, after a long series of short stints in other locations, Lima's Post Office was housed in the front corner of the building, facing onto West Main. Right next to the Post Office to the west was the Frederick Lockington Barber Shop, and according to Doug Morgan, the Cottage Hotel occupied the frontage on Lake Avenue (photo below is from the archives of the Lima Historical Society, scan courtesy of Doug Morgan).



After the building was demolished it was replaced by a Mobil Gas Station owned at one time by George Hanrahan and later by Nelson Thorpe (perhaps others?) (*Photo is from the archives of the Lima Historical Society, scan courtesy of Doug Morgan*). Some years later the new building was refurbished and occupied by an insurance company, and later a satellite dish company (others?). In 2016, the building was extensively renovated, re-sided and repurposed as the Lima Village Pharmacy, owned and operated by Pharmacist Kristin Goold (*Photo courtesy of Kristin Goold*)
