A Century of Ruts, Dust and Macadam

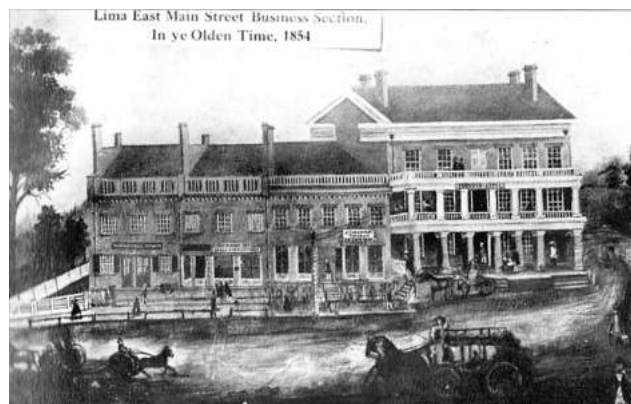

Please join us for our next general meeting to be held on Tuesday, November 15th at 7:30 PM at the Lima Court House. Our speaker is Lynne Belluscio, Director of the LeRoy Historical Society Museum and former coordinator of special events at Genesee Country Museum.

Her slide-illustrated talk will focus on the perils of land travel in the 1700s and 1800s in Western New York. Travelers were met with corduroy roads, axle deep mud, and waist deep snow. The program is taken from diaries and first hand accounts of tourists and pioneers. Stories include traveling on corduroy roads and building plank roads, as well as the tragic ending to an folk tale, "Frozen Charlotte." And, learn why Henry Ford was arrested for speeding in LeRoy — and what he did about it.

TRAVELLING TO AND THROUGH LIMA Some Early Accounts

1792 journey to Lima Interview with John Morgan, an early pioneer in Lima, by Lewis Henry Morgan (Father of American Anthropology) (Morgan Papers V. I, No. 11: p. 216, May 27, 1846 U of R Library, Rare Books)

John Morgan said that he had left Albany **for Lima or Mighells's Tavern**, as it was then known, in February of 1792. There was not a house between Lima and the Genesee River where the Seneca village of Canawaugus was located. He reported that his whole journey was upon the old Indian trail. The path was deeply worn in the ground, and from 2 to 4 and often 6 ft deep. The trail was as easily followed as our road. It was not marked, except by an occasional broken bush.

War of 1812 era From *History of Livingston County* by Lockwood Doty 1876: p. 606.

"It has already been mentioned that **Lima, being upon the old State road**, was an important point in the early days. Especially was this the case during the second war with Great Britain, when troops were constantly passing through town to and from the frontier, and after its close, when the tide of emigration which set in sent a constant stream of emigrants through the place. Inns were opened all along the route, those in Lima being so numerous within the distance of two miles that they were scarcely a stone's throw apart. One of these old hostelries still stands (*in 1876*), a dingy, venerable old building about a mile west of the village of Lima. It is known as the 'Yellow Wasp,' and is occupied as a residence by Mr. Thomas Bishop."

June 4, 1825 Letter from Marquis de Lafayette, Revolutionary General to Governor George Clinton (6/4/1825)

" Tomorrow I leave Buffalo for the Falls of Niagara and Lockport. In case I find a canal boat provided for me, I shall of course take it; if not, I will take any boat that will convey us along the canal to Albany. **I must stop an hour at Lima to lay the corner stone of a monument** to my Companion in Arms, Steuben, and at Utica enjoy the change that has taken place since I was holding Indian treaties at Fort Schulyer..."

*Lafayette is referring to a monument in honor of Baron Frederick Steuben, another Revolutionary War General
