What Is English Country Dancing?

"You say you've never heard of English Country Dancing? You're in good company, since many people are unfamiliar with it. But if you've watched *Pride and Prejudice* on TV or seen *Sense and Sensibility* or *Emma* at the movies, you have indeed seen it. But fear not - English Country Dancing (ECD) is not the obscure relic you might think it to be! While this traditional form of dance has been around for several hundred years, it's still thriving today. There is English Country Dancing all over the United States.

For many, it's the music - hauntingly beautiful tunes that make the heart swell. Some dance tunes are taken from old ballads and political satire; others come from classical music and operas. This gives ECD music tremendous variety; sometimes sweet and melodic, sometimes melancholy, and sometimes absolutely driven with a pulsating beat."

Music and Pranks in Lima

"Music has always played an important role in the life of the community, as evidenced by the fact that College Hall was sometimes called "Concert Hall," as was also a hall on the corner downtown (Masonic Building).

Two brass bands have been formed here, one flourished about 1880, and the second early in the century. Band concerts were given in a bandstand erected on the Four Corners over the side walk on the corner by the church, which was taken down a number of years ago when the band ceased to function. Because of its location, there was no permanent flight of stairs leading up to the playing platform, and the players reached it by a ladder placed in position each time there was a concert. This afforded an opportunity for mischief by some of the youngsters of the day who sometimes removed the ladder during a concert and hid it, thus marooning the players in their lofty perch until it could be found and replaced so that they could descend after they finished playing for the older folks' entertainment."
