HISTORY OF THE LIMA PUBLIC LIBRARY Part II by Mabel Jenks (1976)

(see Part I in September 2007 Yellow Wasp)

The building on Rochester Street in which the library was located for 45 years has had an interesting and unusual history. The original brick building was erected in 1875 by Robert Beale and his son Henry. It was used successively as the Town Hall, a two-cell jail, and the community voting place. In 1921 the Town board authorized the enlargement of the old jail building by the addition of a room to the rear, remodeling of the front part, and a small basement room to house heating, storage, and toilet facilities. Benjamin O. Beale was the contractor in charge of the work. He was the son of Henry Beale and the grandson of Robert Beale who built the original structure. The librarian at the time was his wife, Mrs. Mamie T. Beale, who remained in charge of the library for 41 years, until 1962 when Miss Jeannette Erbe succeeded her. In 1923, the library was moved into its own quarters in this building, which provided excellent space with good shelving. It was considered more than adequate for any future expansion. As time passed, and during the many years from a very small beginning with 50 books, the library had grown to a stock numbering more than 11,000 with a corresponding growth of borrowers and patrons, and again it was "bursting at the seams." Larger quarters and adequate parking spaces became acutely necessary.
