Repair and Restoration of Treasured Furniture

The next meeting of the Lima Historical Society, on Tuesday, November 17th, will offer a rare opportunity to have your "furniture questions" answered by a true expert. John Bailey, owner of Bailey Custom Furniture on Livingston Street in Lima and demonstrator of furniture-making at the School of American Design at RIT, will present a slide-illustrated talk on furniture repair and restoration. He will be on hand to answer questions about the age, wood, and original stain of a piece of your furniture, as well as what techniques might be used to return an aging piece to its former glory. So bring your pictures!!

A longtime resident of Lima, John began to learn his trade at 15 years of age, while working for Ralph Golemb of Decorator's Workshop. After graduating from Lima High School and Finger Lakes Community College, he resumed working at Decorator's workshop, and did evening work on furniture for Frank Singer, also of Lima. When John decided to begin his own business twenty-three years ago, he purchased the old Moses warehouse on Livingston Street, a building that provides spacious areas for work on almost any size piece of furniture. Today, with a touch of classical music playing in the background, John designs and builds custom furniture, cabinetry, and woodwork, as well as restoring, repairing, and reupholstering furniture in his well-lighted, well- organized studio.

It will include repairing and painting ceilings in the museum, and sanding and painting woodwork and stairs where needed. A thorough cleaning of the museum will also take place. We are grateful to the Livingston County Sheriff's Department for their cooperation on this effort to freshen up the Tennie Burton Museum.
