On Tuesday, September 28th, at 7:30 PM at the Lima Court House, the Lima Historical will sponsor a program on the History of the New York State Grange, with a special emphasis on the active days of the local Grange in Lima and Honeoye Falls. Sharon Croucher, Local Lecturer and Program Director of the New York State Grange, will present the program.

Sharon was born and raised in the Grange and is a third generation Granger. A former Juvenile (Junior) Grange member, she has belonged to Clifton Springs Grange #1042 since 1958 and held offices in the local and county Granges. In 1974, she and her husband Bruce were New York State Grange "Young Couple of the Year" and served as New York State Grange Youth Directors from 1975-77. She and Bruce also served as National Grange Youth Directors from 1981-83. In 1999, Sharon was appointed to the National Grange Strategic Planning Task Force.

Sharon received her B.S. in Education and her Masters of Library Science degrees from State University of New York at Geneseo. She retired as a School Library Media Specialist from Midlakes Middle School in the Phelps-Clifton Springs School District. She and her husband live in the farmhouse where she grew up. They have three grown children who are all active Grangers.

HISTORY NOTES

Gillette Bottling Works

"The Gillette Bottling Works was started in 1858 by Schuyler Gillette as a cider mill and developed into a plant making pop and soft drinks, which were shipped for many miles around and to leading hotels and restaurants in New York City, and which enjoyed wide popularity. Mr. Gillette invented a bottle-washing machine, which was put on the market by the Bailey Engine Company, of which Frank Bailey was president, about 1880, and these machines were shipped all over the world. These two operations were housed in what is now the Alfred L. Moses warehouse (now Bailey Custom Furniture) on Livingston Street."

Mike Leavy spent five years accumulating research from small Southern railroads and sifting through over 10,000 Civil War photos in preparation for this new book which is due out in mid October through Westholme Publishing Company. Featuring 220 dramatic Civil War photos, the author explores the impact that railroads had on the war, suggesting that railroads were a major factor in the duration and terrible carnage of the war. The use of trains, he suggests, broke through the old modes of Napoleonic warfare where armies marched for miles and faced-off on

the battle field. Trains now moved thousands of troops to battle sites--most of them around railheads.

The book has a local connection too; it includes excerpts from the diary of a Honeoye Falls soldier, Clark Otis, who, as a member of a military band, accompanied Sherman on his brutal March to the Sea. Otis, great-great grandfather of Sherlee Ruth's children, describes the torn-up rail, blown up trains and unrelenting bombardment of Atlanta. He enters the ruined city after its surrender and take great joy in playing the organ at one of the last churches left standing.

This is Michael's ninth book and first major national title. He has been invited by the National Archives in Washington, DC to give a talk and book signing next March. The book will sell for \$35.
