

On Sunday, May 18th, the Lima Historical Society will hold its Annual Dinner Meeting at the Lima Country Club. The featured speaker, Paul S. Worboys, of Honeoye Falls, will present a nostalgic look at small town baseball when it truly was our "National Game." His slide-illustrated talk, "Baseball in the Hinterlands," will provide a historical sampling of local town ball teams— with special emphasis on the famous "Lima Browns" and Lima's diamond heritage. Mr. Worboys is the author of *Take 'Em Into Camp: The History of the Husky Farmers and Baseball in the Vicinity of Honeoye Falls, NY*.

The program promises to be engaging and fun, with lots of reminiscences about some of Lima's well-known baseball heroes during a time when rivalry with the Honeoye Falls team often drew enormous crowds of Lima fans. #### A Bank for Lima !!

"The first bank in Lima was the 'Merchants and Traders Bank,' located at first on East Main Street and later on Rochester Street...The 'Bank of Lima' was established in 1876 under the control of George W. Thayer, who succeeded the banking firm of Chambers and Watkins. He was followed by Horace C. Gilbert, who operated it as a private bank until it was organized as a State Bank toward the end of his administration. The bank was closed in 1933 during the Bank Moratorium and Lima was without a bank for fifteen years until 1947 when the Genesee Valley Union Trust Company, [now] the Marine Midland Trust Company of Rochester, opened a branch bank here, and it is [now] housed in a beautiful new building which is a great asset to the town." (excerpt from Lima 1788 - 1964: The Crossroads of Western New York, p. 37, by Mabel Jenks). Copies of the book are available at the Tennie Burton Museum for \$5. Call 624-1050.

#### Facade Recommendations for Lima's Downtown Buildings Revisited

Nearly 25 years ago, the Lima Historical Society spearheaded a study of Lima's business district by V. Romanoff and Associates, Restoration and Design Consultants of Ithaca. It was funded by the Genesee Valley Council for the Arts, the Town and Village of Lima, and Elim Bible Institute.

The result was a series color renderings of the buildings, as they could be, and historic photos, illustrating the consultants' written suggestions for some inexpensive facade changes, primarily paint and signage, that would improve the historic appearance of our village center.

With heightened interest in downtown revitalization, the exhibit boards have been resurrected and freshened with new foam boards and coverings, explanatory text, and photos of existing building conditions. They have been rehung in the Town Hall. Come and see them.
