A Round Table Discussion by Former Students and Teachers



On Tuesday, September 23rd at 7:30 pm at the Lima Court House, the Lima Historical Society will present a round table discussion on "One-Room Schoolhouses in Lima." Participants around the table will include some of those with firsthand experience of these educational institutions--former teachers Jane Decker Barnard and Alice Loss, and former pupils, Lee Shanks, Ron Yorks, Louise Stanford. They will share some of their stories and recollections of learning, teaching, playing, and perhaps some misbehaving in these simple schoolhouses of yesteryear.

Two schools will be featured: District 1 School on Doran Road and District 8 on Dalton Rd, but we welcome input and recollections regarding any of Lima's multiple rural school districts. Class pictures and photos of the schools from the Historical Society's collections will be on display to help jog memories. Come and see what and whom you might recognize.

DAR Ska-Hase-Ga-O Chapter 1908-2008

Founded in 1908, and meeting continuously ever since, the Lima chapter of the DAR--the Daughters of the American Revolution--is one of the oldest of the 3000 chapters in the nation. Two LHS members, Barbara Knop and Ellen Gillette, are also active DAR members, and facilitated this year's meeting and tour of the Tennie Burton Museum.

A patriotic organization, membership in the DAR requires that they be able to trace their descent "from an ancestor who aided in achieving United States independence," either as signers of the Declaration of Independence or as participants in some way in the Revolutionary war effort (excerpted from "The Daughters of the American Revolution" by Joyce Rapp). The group participates in many patriotic efforts, such as sending supplies to US service people in hospitals overseas, contributions to the Statue of Liberty restoration, and buying flags for veterans' graves. They also promote education through support of Native American schools, and scholarships for students at all levels.

Please wish them well on this 100th anniversary.

HISTORY NOTES

The Cost of Education in Early Lima

"In 1797, there were 3 Commissioners of Common Schools elected by the Town Meeting to apportion to the school districts their share of public moneys, and at that time, there was \$60.40 due for support of a common school. By 1827, the several school districts had been organized in the town, and the boundaries of each established. In the year 1824, District No. 9 received \$33.28 for 88 pupils, and another district had 5 pupils and received \$1.89. The money was expended in paying teachers duly qualified by law. Through the years, District No. 9, comprising the village and some outlying territory, had the largest apportionment."
