

Stanley's Exchange 7307-9-11 East Main Lima NY 14485

The prominent three-story brick commercial building next to the Masonic Hall on the north side of East Main St. in Lima is now owned and occupied by Richard Garey—but, when was it erected, how was it used originally, and who was Stanley??? Some of these questions must remain unanswered for now, but we do know that the well-to-do Daniel Stanley had sold most of a large farm in Livonia and moved to Lima around 1858 with his wife Maryetta Denison Stanley. He began to invest in many properties here including the commercial building pictured above. The East Main St. appearance of the building was significantly altered when Stanley had it refashioned in the popular Italianate style ca.1868-69. According to its description in the "Lima Village Historic District" nomination to the National Register of Historic Places (1982 (Section 8, p.13), "cast iron lintels and a broadly projecting bracket cornice above a decorative frieze" were added, reflecting the Italianate style that had become so popular during the late 19th century in Lima. The main business in the structure was The Exchange Bank of Lima of which Stanley had become a principal in 1863; he may be the person just barely visible in the first darkened doorway on the left under the small "Stanley Exchange" sign in the photo above. Other early businesses in the building included: an oyster bar below the sidewalk in a basement level facility, as well as an art gallery indicated by a sign saying "L.H. Smith's Art Gallery" between two second floor windows, a first floor sign identifying "Hanna" for an unknown business or office; a daguerreotype studio on the second floor at the back of the building. It features a large north facing window characteristic (continued on p.3)

WHAT IS A MILITARY TANK DOING IN LIMA??

The date is April 30, 1919 and like everyone else in the country, Lima was celebrating the end of World War I. This Whippet tank was brought to Lima and other towns in the area for a demonstration of its capabilities and an opportunity to raise money for the Victory Loan Fund. The crowd responded with contributions of around \$14,000 bringing Lima's full contribution to almost \$30,000. of such photographic studios of the period, which sought the advantages of the north light (see photo on right). Note as well the stepped gables in the photo probably reflecting the building's original construction in the Federal style much earlier in the 1800's. The third floor of the building housed a large ballroom probably originally used for dances, but graffiti on the walls today suggests that it was a site for many other activities over the years:

- 1922-23 Lima High School Basketball Team: with players Nighan, O'Grady, O'Dea, Pierce and Sheehan and their positions listed;
- Square Dance calls;
- Painting of two men playing checkers;
- Dated autographs- Ken O'Dea, Dec.23, 1927; Gerald Nighan, April 3, 1923; Clara Crisp, Jefferson Ohio, July 10, 1893 and John Fitzgerald, Lima.

By all accounts, Daniel Stanley was an upstanding, involved citizen of Lima, a well-liked banker who sponsored a local band, buying all the instruments himself, but who was perhaps generous to a fault in loaning money to his fellow townsmen. Since coming to Lima, he had invested widely in property throughout the area, incurring significant financial responsibilities himself. When the financial panic of 1873 occurred, there were numerous bank failures across New York State as people demanded their money from the unsecured banks. Lima was no exception. The *Dansville Advertiser*, Dec. 23, 1873 reported that the Exchange Bank of Lima was unable to make good on the demands on the bank, and had suspended payments to its customers just that week. Shortly afterward, the bank agreed to settle on 50 cents on the dollar to their former customers.

Stanley, a principal of the bank, became increasingly unable to pay the debts owed on his own investments. He was forced to sell his home on East Main St. along with most of his other properties in town. He fell into deep despondency and was sent to Willard Asylum for the Chronic Insane by his family. Not too long afterward, he escaped from Willard and took a Lehigh Valley train back here to Lima (*Livonia Gazette*, March 26, 1897), but was then taken to a Rochester psychiatric facility (called the Monroe County Insane Asylum at the time) where he eventually died in 1900. He was buried in Oak Ridge Cemetery.
